YOU HAD TO BE THERE

What a delightful party! Word on the street in Point Loma is that the 2004 Annual Dinner at Shelter Pointe Hotel was one of our best ever. Even the weather favored us with late afternoon sunshine breaking through the marine layer while we enjoyed cocktails, conversation and music on the patio. Dinner was delicious, and the evening's program entertaining.

President John Calabotta served as our gracious Master of Ceremonies, while Supervisor Greg Smith and Councilmember Michael Zucchet presented awards to individuals and businesses for community beautification. Ardetta Steiner honored the 2003-2004 Garden Award recipients.

Robert Munson, Cabrillo National Monument historian, told tales of the old Point Loma Lighthouse. Dressed in a replica of the light keeper's uniform and sporting a magnificent beard, Munson gave us his wry, witty perspective on the challenges that were the lot of the keeper and his family. Next came Douglas McElfresh, San Diego Historical Society, with a presentation featuring the 1915 Point Loma Road Race. Who knew that Eddie Rickenbacher was driving racecars right here on the Peninsula before he became a famous WWI flying ace?

Dick Lareau's slide show featured the high points and low points of local architecture, signage and landscape.

Highlights included photos showing the progress of PLA beautification projects through the years in Point Loma Village, Nimitz Boulevard area and, more recently, the Rosecrans corridor. And, there was a memorable photo sequence featuring the cleverly disguised Mike Zucchet checking out our new PLA bus benches.

Annual Dinner Chair Lisa Calabotta would like to thank everyone who helped provide a great night for the 323 members and guests who attended the Annual Dinner. "Klonie Kunzel, Lois Baker, and Jodie Bruhn did a wonderful job organizing the seating and the 'behind the scenes' activities that are crucial to a successful dinner. SIGNATURE BUS BENCH

PLA has completed Phase One of our Bus Bench (and matching trashcan) Project in the village, thanks to generous donations from: Robert and Ginger Wallace, Peter Peckham Family, Bruce Cook, Martha Phillips, San Diego National Bank, Mack and Donis Lovett/Mike Sherwin, Wayne Raffesberger Family, and Con Pane. We extend special thanks to the County of San Diego, Supervisor Greg Cox, for designated grants totaling \$26,000. Thanks also to The Corky McMillin Companies for helping to support the cost of installation. We have installed 17 benches and 11 trashcans on Rosecrans between Nimitz and Talbot. Total cost of the project was \$30,059.

For the first time, Point Loma has its own signature benches. PLA also contacted The Corky McMillin Companies, and they agreed to install the same bench along Rosecrans fronting Liberty Station. Now, from Lytton/Barnett all the way to Talbot, every bench is the same style, a bench unique in the city. In Phase Two, we plan to install the same bench along Canon and Scott streets, creating a pedestrian-friendly ambience. NTC FOUNDATION CAMPAIGN

NTC Promenade plans to pave the way for its new mission as "San Diego's Center for Innovation and Creativity" brick by brick. The Commemorative Brick Campaign is a fundraising strategy designed to honor the past and build for the future. The NTC Foundation, a private 501(C)3 nonprofit corporation, is charged with the preservation and renovation of 26 historic buildings at the former Naval Training Center. YMCA PROJECT TAKES OFF

The Peninsula Family YMCA has launched a \$5.2 Million Capital Program to improve facilities and increase services to the Point Loma and Ocean Beach communities. The program includes construction of a therapy pool, a multi-use gymnasium (shared with Correia Jr. High for Physical Education classes), and renovation of existing facilities including a wellness center, child watch, teen/senior center and community rooms.

A generous lead gift from the Ryan Family has helped the YMCA raise more than 2.7 Million to date. Upon completion, the new YMCA will be known as the Claude and Gladys Ryan Family YMCA. The project features aeronautical themes, enhanced by a partnership with the San Diego Aerospace Museum.
